Highlights From TLD's First 2 Years

Documented Success and Performance

The Lion's Den Missions Base has an aggressive goal of training and coordinating teams to deploy material and human resources and support across the Continental US and abroad. In an effort to reach this ambitious goal quickly and effectively, TLD members have worked diligently accomplishing the following benchmarks since October of 2015:

- Established partnerships with the American Red Cross, FEMA, Salvation Army.
- Supported Disaster Relief victims in Baton Rouge, Louisiana in Hurricane Season 2016.
- Raised funds for Disaster Relief for hurricane recovery in Florida, Puerto Rico and Houston in the 2017 Hurricane season.
- Distributed over 2,000,000 pounds of food through the Tree of Life Food Bank.
- ➤ Acquired State of Florida Department of Education licensing to issue academic certification and diplomas.
- Established and streamlined the Broward Transformation Center as an independent crisis counseling entity.
- > Senior member of TLD launched the United Nations Chaplains Association as a professional extension of the Lion's Den Missions Base.
- > Established complete training and certification tracks for TLD's Rapid Response, Crisis Counseling, Leadership and Mentoring programs.
- > Increased the number of FEMA and American Red Cross trained volunteers at TLD.
- Rapid Recovery Responder team was deployed to Broward International Airport to provide emotional support and resources to passengers detained at the Airport in the aftermath of a shooting in the Airport in 2016
- Acquired and deployed a 24 foot GMC 5,500 box truck at a cost of 50% off cost. On the same day the truck was acquired, the Lion's Den Missions Base received donation of 8,000 pounds of frozen turkeys and delivered these goods immediately to community residents.
- ➤ Located and assumed strategically located commercial real estate office warehouse space in Fort Lauderdale at a 40% discount.
- Acquired and deployed a 15-passenger Ford E-350 van at a 40% discount.
- > Established two Community Resource sites and one Community Distribution site in Broward County.

Community Support & Redevelopment Initiative

The Lion's Missions Base is community centric deploying its Community Support & Redevelopment Initiative to meet the needs of America's neighborhoods. Because each community need is different, TLD possesses the flexibility to adapt its structure and focus to meet the demand of each community it serves. TLD supports communities in times of "blue sky" by determining distribution sites and staging areas to share essential goods and services to vulnerable populations on a continual basis.

TLD's Community Support & Redevelopment Initiative is comprised of:

- Community Resource Sites (CRS): TLD provides "one-stop shops" in strategic locations such as low income housing and municipal centers to meet community-level needs. In collaboration with partners, TLD establishes an on-going distribution of food resources and services such as job assistance, counseling, tutoring, grocery support and mentorship until neighborhoods are stabilized and lives are enhanced. Volunteers have the opportunity choose from a variety of CRS locations and jobs.
- Community Distributions Sites(CDS): TLD distributes food and goods in strategic locations where needs are determined. TLD provides on-going distribution of resources until a neighborhood is stabilized or until the opportunity arises to launch a Community Resource Site at the location. Volunteers have the opportunity choose from a variety of CDS locations and jobs.
- Tree of Life Food Bank (TOL): TLD's strategic partner the Tree of Life Food Bank serves as the provider of all food and goods required at TLD operated CRS's and CDS's. Volunteers have the opportunity to serve in this initiative through the acquisitions, management and distribution of food and goods through TOL

Crisis Counseling and Inner Healing Initiative

The effects of emotional distress on an individual are not always. In partnership with Broward Transformation Center and Our Children's Our Future, The Lion's Den Missions Base (TLD) launched its Crisis Counseling and Inner Healing Initiative to address the emotional and mental trauma of vulnerable populations. Trained TLD volunteers provide emotional and spiritual support through offering "listening ear", "guided word" or providing referral to other resources or professionals.

TLD's Crisis Counseling and Inner Healing Initiative focuses on providing:

- > Defusing the critical nature of the situations and circumstances,
- Ensuring the safety of those involved in unsafe environments; and
- Returning individuals to a state of equilibrium to capably identify and seek solutions to tough circumstances.

Through training volunteers in TLD's Crisis Counseling and Inner Healing Initiative are able to:

- Listen actively with concern and empathy,
- > Encourage open expression of feelings,
- Assist in gaining an understanding of the crisis;
- > Support individuals gradually accept reality;
- > Identify suitable methods of coping;
- Link those in need with appropriate social services.

Rapid Response & Relief Team Initiative

In times of crisis The Lion's Den Missions Base (TLD) is positioned to respond swiftly and efficiency to those impacted adversely. In partnership with the United Nations Chaplains Association TLD launched its Rapid Response & Relief Initiative to support mankind in life's most trying times. TLD Rapid Response Teams (RRT's) strives to deploy into a community within 24 hours to investigate damages while sending team members within 48 hours to support preliminary efforts. TLD and its partners provide direct response in disasters by staging emergency distribution sites to provide essential goods, services and counsel to vulnerable populations.

TLD RRT volunteers are deployed for the purposes of:

- Responding to Natural Disasters: TLD is equipped to direct and support restorative efforts as well as provide necessary resources (food, water, shelter and clothing). These service measure are accomplished all while deploying members to provide crisis counseling and spiritual care support. With strong relationships at the local-community level, TLD frequently serves as the contact point and director for hundreds of agencies (food banks, faith-based groups, housing providers, etc.) to effectively deploy to disaster events.
- > Supporting Community & Economic Redevelopment: TLD works with local and federal leaders to establish and deploy long-term strategies to rebuild.
- Responding to Social Instability: TLD supports communities by acting as a social bridge between citizens and government agencies during periods of social unrest.

Responding to Communities Year-Round

"Deploying Where and When Needed"

TLD's Role in The Disaster Response Cycle

TLD is a uniquely positioned and trusted partner in building robust, sustainable programs and systems to support communities in protecting against, preparing for, responding to, and recovering from disaster or civil emergencies:

- **Mitigation:** TLD works with government, community, and spiritual leaders to build infrastructure (procedural and economic) in preparation for disaster response. TLD develops localized strategies for risk reduction and prevention. TLD emphasizes Mitigation as the most impactful phase to ensure reduction of loss from calamity. TLD provides communities leaders with ongoing engagement, training, and support. This ultimately promotes mitigation efforts, risk prevention campaigns, and prevention strategies for their house of worship, and their members and followers
- **Preparedness:** TLD works with local, federal, and community leaders to ensure disaster preparedness.

 Evacuation plans, sources for water and food, and effective rescue strategies are all determined and established in efforts to provide plans of action.
- **Response:** TLD underscores the faith community's importance in restoring communities during a disaster. During a disaster, TLD leverages its network of over 2,000 houses of worship and community leaders in gathering and disseminating real-time information, to and from national disaster relief agencies, as well as federal, local government. TLD also establishes strategic points of distribution (PODS) to deploy clothing, food, housing accommodations, home repair, debris removal, and other critical goods and services.
- **Recovery:** TLD supports communities by acting as a social and economic bridge between citizens and the resources they need to fully recover from a catastrophic event. TLD sources and assimilates long-term recovery and unmet needs programs through its network of local participant until restoration has been recognized.

Initiative #82916 Baton Rouge Housing Initiative

Initiative Overview

The flooding in Louisiana was one of the worst natural disaster in the United States since Superstorm Sandy in 2012. Alongside of The Red Cross, The Lion's Den Mission Base supported the massive relief operation in Baton Rouge. TLD's goal was to restore a sense of normalcy to the community by returning families to their homes.

The Baton Rouge Area Chamber (BRAC) released data estimates over 140,000 homes in the metropolitan area were in flood areas and could have been affected. Livingston and East Baton Rouge parishes appear to have suffered the most damage. BRAC estimates more than \$9 billion in damages to homes there. Businesses fared badly as well in the Baton Rouge Metropolitan Statistical Area, which includes East Baton Rouge and eight surrounding parishes. BRAC also estimates 12,000 or 35% of all businesses in the region were adversely affected. This number directly affects over 136,000 workers.

With crisis-trained members readied, TLD was able to mobilize within 48 hours of assignment notification and connected with local agencies to identify areas of opportunity and structure to support Baton Rouge in Two Phases:

Phase One: From August 26, 2016 through October 31, 2016, BRHI focused on supporting local shelters with tangible goods to sustain residences during their transition. The Lion's Den Mission Base provided on the ground support in Red Cross managed shelters during Phase One.

Direct financial contributions were utilized for:

- -Foods that meet unusual dietary requirements
- -Hygiene supplies and other comfort items
- -Supplies needed for children and infants (such as diapers, formula, and toys)
- -Special items for elderly and disabled family members

TLD also supported the feeding of over 400 displaced residents through the Sponsorship of Baton Rouge based non-profit, Saint Vincent De Paul

Phase Two: From September 19, 2016 through September 28, 2016 TLD provided over 200 impacted, Winborne Elementary students with uniforms, book bags and school supplies.

Phase Three: On November 1, 2016, TLD began its Social and Economic Redevelopment initiative to provide distressed communities with access to progressive technology, education, and economic opportunities.



Initiative#10316 Hurricane Matthew Relief Initiative

Initiative Overview

Hurricane Matthew is likely one of the strongest hurricanes to impact Caribbean and the Southeastern United States within the last decade. The storm has registered as the first Category 5 Atlantic hurricane since Hurricane Felix of 2007. Matthew formed from a vigorous tropical wave that slowly moved off the African coast on September 22, 2016 on a westward track until developing into a tropical storm as it was situated just to the East of the Leeward Islands on September 28, 2016. One day later, Hurricane Matthew rapidly strengthened into a Category 5 hurricane as it impacted the Caribbean on its way towards the Southeastern coast of the Continental U.S.

After completing a successful month-long effort to restore those affected by the Baton Rouge flood, the United Nations Chaplains quickly reassembled to respond to those impacted by Hurricane Matthew. Relief efforts extended to areas of Northeastern Florida, South Carolina, and North Carolina (Robeson County) that were also affected. In partnership with the American Red Cross, FEMA and the Tree of Life Food Bank (www.themissionscenter.org), TLD mobilized with crisis trained responders to assist with the sustainment and recovery efforts associated with Hurricane Matthew in two phases:

Phase One: During Phase One, from October 5, 2016 through October 14, 2016, TLD provided shelter, food and community restoration efforts to those impacted within the South Florida region. TLD partnered with the Tree of Life Food Bank, The American Red Cross, and The Lion's Den Missions Base to provide on the ground support during Phase One. TLD led Rapid Response Teams' streamlined efforts through community leaders to deploy concentrated resources to the community level.



TLD provided:

- -Bottled water and canned foods
- -Hygiene supplies and other comfort items
- -Supplies needed for children and infants (such as diapers & formula)
- -Clean up supplies (such as heavy-duty garbage bags)
- -Special items for the elderly and disabled

Phase Two: During Phase Two from October 14, 2016 through November 1, 2016 TLD deployed to Lumberton, Red Springs, Maxton and "Thunder Valley" North Carolina deploying tangible good to over 4,000 residents.

Phase Three: On November 2, 2016, TLD launched its Social and Economic Redevelopment to provide distressed communities with progressive technology, educations and economic opportunities. TLD is continuing the efforts to prepare local governments with strategies and resources needed for Disaster Mitigation.



Initiative #133309 South Florida FL Community Support and Redevelopment

Initiative Overview

Located in beautiful South Florida, Broward County is world-known for its beaches, shopping and yachting. Though uncommon wealth can be found in the area, there is also an underserved demographic of those in need of economic opportunity. Family poverty rates continue to increase in the County, although 60 percent of economically-poor families have at least one working adult. According to 2014 population estimates, 15 % of Broward County residents are under the poverty line.

In partnership with Tree of Life Food Bank (www.themissionscenter.org), TLD mobilized a long-term effort to assist with providing social and economic opportunities through the establishment of two community resource sites:

The Village Mobile Home Park (The Village): Owned and managed by Riverstone Communities (Riverstone), located in Florida, The Village Mobile Home Park is home to over 500 families. With the community being primarily comprised of families earning income under the poverty line, TLD partnered with Riverstone to deploy a long term social and economic impact campaign. In July 2016, TLD began supporting the over 1500 residents with weekly grocery deliveries, peer-to-peer program support, free children's summer programs, tutoring, and language assistance.

The First Step Sober Home (First Step): First Step provides programs which serve as alternatives to incarceration, as well as rehabilitation services from the disease of addiction through a strict program of recovery. Located in Pompano Beach, Florida, the group has earned a vendor number (3MJ) as a recognized institution for alternative housing by the state of Florida Department of Corrections. In May 2017, after executing a Memorandum of Understanding with First Step, TLD began supporting the over 300 residents with biweekly grocery deliveries, peer-to-peer program support, and educational opportunities.







Initiative#772319 Hurricane Irma Preparation, Response & Relief Initiative

On September 4, 2017 Hurricane Irma became Category 4 intensity storm as it approached the U.S. Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico and South Florida. In response to the possible threat Florida Gov. Rick Scott declared a state of emergency in all 67 counties in his state. The UNCA's mission was to act quickly in maintaining and restoring a sense of relief and normalcy to impacted communities by streamlining relief efforts through multiple agencies.

Phase One: In cooperation with Federal Emergency Management Agency, The American Red Cross (ARC) and local municipalities, the UNCA established key initiatives which to preserve human life. TLD supported it partner UNCA to leverage over 300 South Florida, faith-based organizations (representing over 10,000 parishioners) to assists establish Bulk distribution sites throughout 20 heavily impacted cities. The UNCA also provided real-time data to ARC for the identification and reallocation of resources and coordinated the delivery of over 800,000 pounds of food, water and resources to:

North Miami, Florida Pompano Beach, Florida Avon Park, Florida Bonita Springs, Florida Leigh Acres, Florida, Dunbar, Florida Lake Placid, Florida Fort Lauderdale, Florida Immokolee, Florida and others.

Initiative #772320 Hurricane Maria Caribbean Relief Initiative

On September 19, 2017 Hurricane Maria made landfall in Dominica as a Category 5 hurricane before moving on to devastate Puerto Rico and neighboring islands. In the wake of Hurricane Maria, the small island of Dominica was destroyed and Puerto Rico's 3 Millions American citizens rendered almost entirely without power. Initial reports estimated that 80% of island's transmission lines (which deliver power from the energy plants) have been incapacitated, with substantially all local power lines (facilitating to residences/business) being destroyed as well.

Phase One: From September 25, 2017 through October 31, 2017, TLD assisted the UNCA in continue to coordinating with local officials to deliver food, resources and logistical support to those impacted in Puerto Rico and neighboring regions. The UNCA has successfully established flight and distribution operations throughout the island, narrowing its focus to smaller underserved population within Puerto Rico. Strategic partnerships have produced the allocation of cargo aircraft, warehousing and private passenger flights to ensure logistical efficiency.

The UNCA is providing:

- -Logistic Support
- -Crisis Counseling/Shelter Support
- -Delivery of bottled water and canned foods, hygiene supplies and other comfort items.

Phase Two: From October 31, 2017 through December 31, 2017 TLD will support the UNCA in establishing Bulk Distribution sites and Multi Agency Centers throughout the Central and Southern portions of the island of Puerto Rico. On October 14, 2017 the UNCA created bilateral- synergies with officials assigned to the disaster relief efforts from the U.S. Coast Guard, Department of Homeland Security, Air Force, island municipalities and local business operators. The strategic partnerships resulted in streamlined transportation logistics, security, increased distribution channels and thousands of warehouse square footage located throughout the island for use by UNCA and partners.
